Newsletter N°8 is published ahead of the usual June date because I want to strongly emphasise the importance of participation by many European parasitologists in the next EMOP in Turku, Finland.

Turku is a delightful city on the southwest coast of Finland and was founded at the end of the 13th century, making it the oldest city in Finland. Turku was designated the European Capital of Culture for 2011 and is surrounded by a beautiful archipelago, one of the largest in the world...

EMOP will be organized in the downtown campus of Turku University where there is a long tradition of studying Parasites as a Parasitological Institute was founded there in 1963 with the main goal of eradicating *Diphyllobothrium latum* from Finland...

It is the first time that an EMOP is organized so far in the North and it will be a good opportunity to discuss Arctic Parasitology and Global warming... But do not be afraid, the weather in Turku in July is very similar to the weather of a lot of European cities or regions with open air swimming pools...

During the next EMOP, a new EFP board will be elected; the venue of EMOP 13 in 2020 will be decided. The general assembly will discuss the important issues concerning Parasitology in Europe and do not hesitate to contact me if you want to put some special questions to the Agenda.

One of the aims of the EFP is to attract students to these European Multicolloquia to allow them to present their work, meet colleagues and constitute a

network... **The EFP will offer 30 grants to students covering the registration fees.**

The EFP also organize a competition between young scientists (less than 35 years) to offer them **5 Young Scientists Awards**. The YSA recipients will receive a 400 euros prize, refunding of registration fees, diploma and medal). 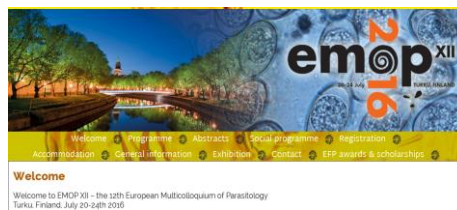
Lab Times Publication analysis 2007-2013 in Parasitology !

The Lab Times published its usual analysis of national ranking of publications in Parasitology. They used "Thomson Reuters' Web of Science database for publication analysis and the numbers for the nations' ranking is based on so-called "expert journals", as it's impossible to retrieve parasitologically-themed papers from multi-disciplinary journals, like Nature or Science.... For the top 30 most-cited authors, however, all journals and papers were permitted, no matter where they had been published".

The results are: "Worldwide, European parasitologists published more articles, gathering more citations, than their US peers. But the citation-per-article ratio, once again, argues for the colleagues from across the pond (13.3 vs. 16.0). In third spot is not one of the usual suspects like Australia or China but Brazil".
